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Pulitzer Prize-Winning Author Gilbert M. Gaul Coming to Toms River Library

TOMS RIVER – The Toms River Branch of the Ocean County Library will host “Climate Change and Our Communities” featuring author Gilbert M. Gaul at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Sep. 17.

Two-time Pulitzer Prize-winning author Gilbert M. Gaul and coastal resiliency expert Chris Huch will hold a conversation about Gaul’s new book, “The Geography of America’s Coasts.” The discussion will focus on coastal development and the extraordinary risks posed by climate change, including communities along Barnegat Bay.

Gaul has worked as an investigative journalist for the Washington Post, Philadelphia Inquirer, and other newspapers for over 35 years. He has also reported on nonprofit organizations, the business of college sports, homeland security, the black market for prescription drugs, and Medicare problems.

This program is being held as part of the Ocean County Library’s programming in support of “Water/Ways,” a Museum on Main Street exhibition organized by the Smithsonian Traveling Exhibition Service, made possible by a grant from the New Jersey Council for the Humanities, a state partner of the National Endowment for the Humanities.
