

TAKE & MAKE

3D Heart Tree



1. Gather supplies



2. Fold hearts in half at the point



3. Use a marker to draw your ground



4. Glue the tree on the "ground"



5. Glue hearts to tree



6. Hearts can be grouped in any pattern



7. Add falling heart leaves

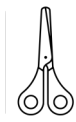


8. Can be framed in standard 8x10"



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Supplies:



Scissors



Assorted cardstock



Glue



Black marker

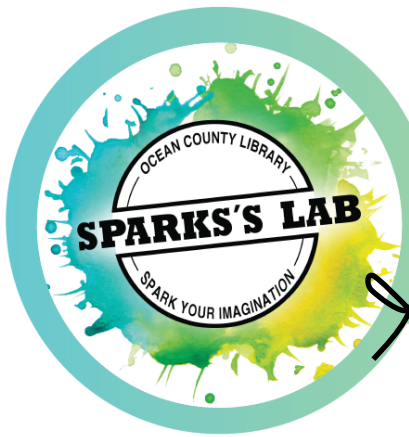
You may choose to cut out the patterns below to use as a template with any light weight cardstock.

Instructions:

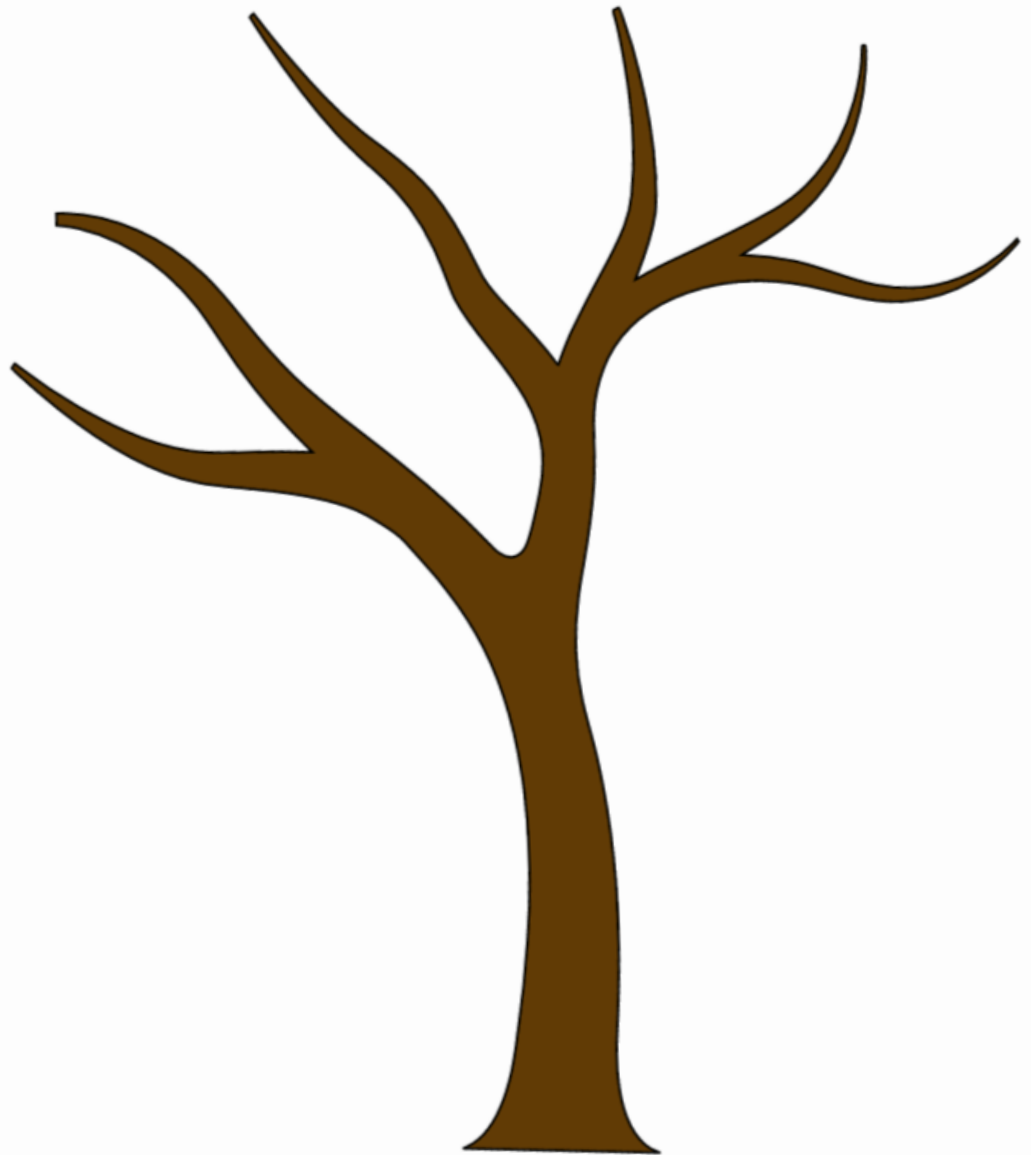
1. Print template on cardstock and cut out the tree and heart templates. Choose a selection of colored cardstock. (We have chosen a fall color theme but patterned paper would look great too.) You will need to trace and cut about 50 hearts.
2. Fold hearts in half down the center, making a vertical crease that connects the indent of the heart to the point.
3. Hold a piece of 8x10" white cardstock vertically and use a marker to draw the ground about an inch from the bottom.
4. Glue the tree trunk to the white background, centering the tree along the ground.
5. Glue the heart "leaves" to the tree. Create a 3D look by only gluing down one side of the folded hearts.
6. Create groups of leaves or simply place them randomly.
7. Reserve a few hearts to resemble leaves falling to the ground.
8. This project can be framed in a 8x10" frame.



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
